- *Shane will provide a link to the NCDENR Mining and Energy Commission Draft Rules for Nancy to email to members*


No one was present to make public comments.

## **SNS Update-LEPC Meeting September 24<sup>th</sup>, 2014**

### **I. Strategic Plans for KI Distribution**

- a. Potassium Iodide (KI) pills will be dispensed October 11 from 9am-2pm at Cape Fear and Deep River Fire Departments for all residents in Emergency Planning Zone (EPZ)
- b. 914 Postcards have been mailed to EPZ residents
- c. Print media and social media will be used to push information to stakeholders

### **II. Five-year Full-scale Medical Countermeasure Dispensing Plan**

- a. Partners involved in this effort include Emergency Services, General Services, Security, ARC, Closed POD partners, and public health staff
- b. This will test LCHD's capability to receive, inventory, pick, and mass distribute meds to the residents of Lee County
- c. Rubrics training to be held in October as State is looking at new benchmarks to be met
- d. After rubrics training, will discuss and meet with stakeholders mentioned above to develop a strategy for optimal public value for each organization involved
