The Lee County Emergency Planning Committee met at 11:30 a.m. on June 15, 2011 at Lee County Emergency Services in Sanford, NC.

Chairman Roger Tankersley called the meeting to order; introductions followed.

A motion was made by Shane Seagroves to accept the minutes as presented from the March 9th meeting; seconded by David Vann; unanimous vote.

Old Business:

Action Items from 6/15/2011:

- Hazard Mitigation Update – Roger Millikin will email the Hazard Mitigation Plan (that has been reviewed by NCEM with recommended changes and approved by FEMA) to the LEPC
- Emergency Response Plan – Shane Seagroves will discuss the plan with NCEM and provide an update at the September 14th meeting
- SNS Plan Contact Update Information – Heath Cain requests the LEPC to complete and return the contact information form either via hard copy or email
- Lee County LEPC Membership – Roger Millikin will contact LEPC members who have not provided information for this spreadsheet one-on-one in order to hand out the completed spreadsheet at the September 14th meeting

New Business:

Heath Cain gave a review of the SNS Plan and asked that each LEPC member provide contact information to allow the SNS Plan to be updated and to correct any changes that must be made to the existing SNS Plan.

Shane Seagroves shared lessons learned from the April 16, 2011 tornado that ripped a swath a half-mile wide and 10 miles long through Lee County. As devastating as the destruction was, Shane added that Lee County was very lucky to have had only 2 deaths from this event and that it had been an educational experience from response to recovery. Don Kovasckitz stated that GIS (on the Lee County website) has posted aerial photographs of structures before and after the tornado.

The role of the LEPC in similar or future events was discussed by the group. Some topics of discussion included adding the LEPC contacts into DeltAlert (Reverse 911 System) for rapid notification, if needed. Another beneficial role of the LEPC in an emergency event would be the identification of company specialists, to be able to assist Emergency Services.

David Vann asked for clarification on the curfew issues experienced during the recent tornado event.

Debbie Hatfield, Field Planner from North Carolina Emergency Management, gave an update on Domestic Preparedness Regions (DPRs) 4 and 6; adding that the generator project will still go through; and that the Emergency Operations Center (EOC) grant is available until June 20th.


The next meeting for the LEPC has been scheduled for September 14, 2011.
